Curriculum Overview - Year 10

The Big Picture:

Year 10 students begin with a study of Germany from 1890-45 and then move on to the a very different period of History, the Restoration under Charles II. The later part of the year is spent revisiting Medicine through Time which students were introduced to during year 9.

AO1: demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the key features and characteristics of the period studied.

AO2: explain and analyse historical events and periods studied using second-order historical concepts.

AO3: analyse, evaluate and use sources (contemporary to the period) to make substantiated judgements, in the context of historical events studied.

AO4: analyse, evaluate and make substantiated judgements about interpretations (including how and why interpretations may differ) in the context of historical events studied.
